TCKC will host 2 Fast CAT and 1 Coursing Ability event each on Saturday, March 7th, 2026 and Sunday, March 8th 2026.

Pre-entries will close on February 25th, 2026, at 6:00 p.m. **NO FEES WILL BE PAID UNTIL DAY OF.** Day-of event entries will be accepted from February 25th, 2026, 6:01 p.m. until 1 hour prior to check-in for each event.

The test field is a fenced fairgrounds. Please be sure your dog can be caught at the end of the race. Dogs must be on leash at all times except when running. Owners of loose dogs may be charged a penalty and/or asked to leave the property by the ranch owner.

Two separate Fast Cat tests are being offered each day. The 2 Fast CAT tests will be run CONCURRENTLY each day with no limits The Fast CAT run area will be fully fenced. There will be 1 coursing ability test (CABT) run daily after fast at is completed You may use 1 entry form to enter 1 or more of the tests for the same dog by marking the boxes for the tests you wish to enter. Each test requires a separate entry fee. Each dog requires a separate entry form. The attached entry form can be filled out online prior to printing. Please indicate the size of the dog on the entry form. **Incomplete/unsigned/unpaid/conditional entries will not be accepted.** If you are entering more than 1 dog per test and you wish to have them separated by other

Note: These events will be canceled/postponed if the field is flooded, or the weather forecast seems unsafe for the events to be held. Any cancellation decision will be made on Wednesday March 4th, 2026, and exhibitors will be advised if the events are to be canceled.

Location: Butte County Fairgrounds, 199 E Hazel ST, Gridley, CA 95948

Directions: From the north or south in Gridley on Hwy. 99, turn east on Hazel at the traffic light. Drive one block and you will enter the fairgrounds. From north or south on Hwy 70 turn west at East Gridley Rd traffic light continue west and turn right on Fairview Dr then right on Hazel and enter the fairgrounds.

Who May Enter: These tests are open to all dogs at least 12 months of age that are individually registered with the AKC, recorded in the Foundation Stock Service (FSS) program, individually registered with a foreign or domestic registry organization whose pedigrees are acceptable for AKC registration, dogs granted a Purebred Alternative Listing (PAL) number, dogs with AKC Limited or Conditional Registration, or dogs enrolled in the AKC Canine Partners program. Dogs with breed disqualifications and monorchid/cryptorchid dogs are eligible to participate. A dog may enter only once per event; an event is defined by an event number. **Females in season may not compete; the entry fee will be refunded.** Dogs may be enrolled in the AKC Canine Partners program on the day of the event and compete that day.

These tests will be conducted with an electronic timer. Back-up manual timing will be available. A battery-powered, continuous-loop system will be used with white or colored plastic streamers for the lure. Back-up equipment will be available.

Test: The Fast CATs will start as soon dogs are checked in and the run order is determined. The Coursing Ability test rollcall and inspection will start at approximately 1pm.


Inspection/Roll Call starts for fast cat at 8:00 a.m. first come first serve. Do not bring your dog to check in. Inspection is for fitness, lameness, and "in season females" DOGS MUST BE REINSPECTED BEFORE EACH RUN.

After pre-entries close, entrants will be notified by email of entry receipt/acceptance and entry totals for each test. The run order will be determined the day of the event. **Please be sure the writing on your entry form is clear and legible!!!**

Tests Offered: Coursing Ability Test:

Course plan: 600 yards or 300 yards (for dogs shorter than 12 inches and/or brachycephalic dogs). Veterans (age 7 or older on the day of the test) may run 2/3s of the normal course distance. **Please designate the course length on your entry form.** The Club reserves the right to alter course due to field and/or weather conditions on the day of the test. The judge for November 15th and 16th is Jane Taylor.

The course plan shown is an approximation. The Start/Finish line is the red mark. Each loop is planned to be 300 yards. Another option is a single loop course of 600 yards, depending on the judge's preference.



Fast CAT Test:

Course plan: Fast CAT tests are divided into 3 categories dependent on the size of the dog. The size category is used in the calculation to determine how many points are awarded towards AKC Fast CAT titles based on the mile per hour (MPH) of the dog's run. Please indicate on your entry form if the dog is less than 12 inches, 12 inches but less than 18 inches, or 18 inches or over. If the height is questionable, the Inspection Committee will

measure a dog to be sure.

Notice to Fast CAT handlers: Section 14. Conduct of Handlers. Handlers are not permitted to run down the 100-yard course with a dog during its run. If the course is fenced, this includes both inside or outside the fence. Handlers shall simply release the dog in the starting box and may not run with the dog within the starting box. Handlers may run within the catchment area as their dog is running the course but may not cross the finish line. Cheering, clapping, calling your dog's name, whistling, and waving your arms from the end of the course or the start area is allowed. Noise making devices such as whistles, duck calls, electronic calls or other items of this nature are not permitted. The use of toys, treats, flags, or other items of this nature are not permitted while the dog is running the 100-yard course, however they may be used after the dog has crossed the finish line to assist in catching the dog. Should a situation arise where the application of this Regulation is open for interpretation, the event committee shall decide how it will be handled. An explanation shall be submitted to the AKC along with the event results. TCKC will not allow "catchers" to walk down the course prior to their dog/s run; the "catcher" must go to the Finish Line outside of the course. Dogs and catchers must exit the field through the gate and return on the dirt road outside the fence.

Turn right on the road between the vet hospital and Sizzler and then turn right into the vet hospital parking lot. **VCA Northpointe Vet. is no longer a 24-hour emergency facility; please call ahead.**
